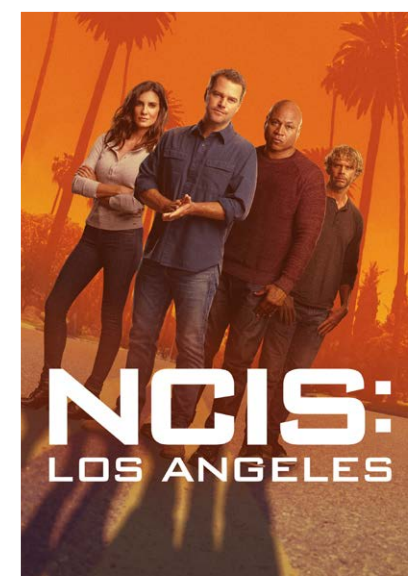
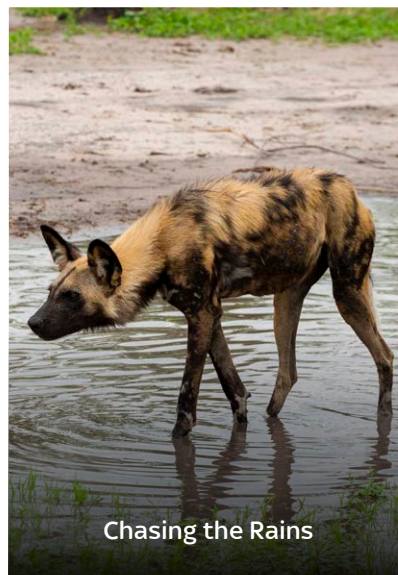

Her two sisters Clare (Gabby Best) and Leila (Aimee-Ffion Edwards) rally around her with their mum (Frances Barber) and their Margate-legend nan (Sheila Reid), "manifesting" a little girl at Trish's 'mani-festival'. But when their other sister, Mel (Lily Allen), makes an unexpected reappearance back into their lives, her return threatens to destabilise the entire family. Chasing the Rains

Part 1 of 4

Filmed beyond the jagged peaks of Mount Kenya, in the great rangelands of the north, the series begins at the end of the long rains, when river valleys, plains and mountains are flushed with new growth. Water is the lifeblood of this sprawling landscape and all life here dances to the tune of the rains. Many months or sometimes years pass before a drop of rain falls so all species must learn to survive these droughts which are increasing in intensity due to climate change. Episodes feature heroic cheetah mother Kuleta defending her precious cubs against attacks from rival predators; a rare wild dog pack battling a vicious hyena clan in a quest for food and water; and Samburu elephant herds using intelligence and resilience to locate water for their families. The series will also feature the stories of the nomadic people who live on these lands and share resources with the wildlife. Narrated by Bridgerton's Adjoa Andoh.

Settle in for the Saturday evening game between Chelsea and Aston Villa, with the two teams, perhaps surprisingly, holding up the middle of the Premier League table. Chelsea have had a nightmare season, while Villa have had a steady season and could leapfrog the blues into the top half of the table with a win at Stamford Bridge.

Then it's on to Super Sunday, kicking things off with a lower table clash between West Ham and Southampton. The Hammers are far from safe this season, just a single point above the drop zone, while the Saints are desperately trying to claw their way from the bottom following a dire series of matches. A win at West Ham for either team could make all the difference. Then, we head back up the table for a grudge match between Newcastle and Manchester United. The Reds were looking like dark horses in the title race before their shocking 7-0 defeat at Anfield, while the Magpies need to get back into the race for a top five finish after a run of disappointing results.

Then into the week, we have a Monday Night Football battle as Spurs travel to Everton. Tottenham too have had some disappointing games of late and are fighting to keep their European hopes alive, while the Toffee's situation is even more urgent as they fight to avoid relegation from the top flight for the first time. And we close things off on Tuesday night as Chelsea take on their second match of the week, this time hosting a Liverpool side looking to turn around a relatively mediocre season with the momentum from their aforementioned thrashing of Man United.
