After failing upward, the unlikely pair lands on the Committee to Re-Elect the President, plotting several unbelievable covert ops – including bugging the Democratic National Committee offices at the Watergate complex. Proving that fact is sometimes stranger than fiction, White House Plumbers sheds light on the lesser-known series of events that led to one of the greatest political scandals in American history.

Premier League Final Day

We come to the end of what has been an epic season of Premier League action, and in many ways a tale of two tables. On the one hand Arsenal and Manchester City have put on dominant performances that made this year a two-horse race, although the Gunner's commanding eight-point lead now feels like a long time ago now. On the other, the gulf between the top half of the table and the bottom half has been so substantial that at the midpoint of the season every team in the last eight were at one point in the conversation regarding relegation. Things have settled somewhat since then, but at least five teams still need to be concerned with the drop zone. While we wait to see if Manchester City can press their advantage and win a third consecutive Premier League championship (their ninth overall), teams like Everton face the prospect of spending their first ever season in the EFL Championship. And could we see a rare season where all last year's teams promoted from the EFL book in a second season in the Premiership?

Katherine Hepburn: Call me Kate

Katharine 'Kate' Hepburn was definitive and distinctive, a force of nature, a once-in-a generation talent, whose progressive and free-spirited nature defined her roles. She was nominated for twelve Academy Awards, winning a record four for Best Actress. 


Women's Super League: Final Day
