





**In the second series, Ray Lennox is ready to return to the fray at Edinburgh Serious Crimes, keen to prove he is fully recovered from his breakdown.**

However, he's surprised to find that it's all change: Bob Toal has lost his mojo, Amanda Drummond is newly promoted, and there are two new faces on the team in the form of the devious Tommy Stark and failed actor Norrie Erskine.

When one of Lennox's former colleagues is attacked, Lennox and Drummond quickly realise that all is not as it seems as they become embroiled in a case about vengeance, identity and social justice. The attack is linked to a gruesome attempted murder on a high-ranking establishment figure at a posh hotel which has been hushed up from the police - as Lennox investigates via Edinburgh's saunas, crack dens and poshest hotels, he finds doors slammed in his face as there is an establishment cover-up at play.

It's not until the killer targets one of Lennox's own team that the pieces start to fall into place - tracing the motivation back to an unsavoury incident 30 years ago, Lennox begins to realise that there is more to this case than meets the eye and the killer he has been chasing may not be the driving force behind these murders after all.
