ITV Racing: Live from Newcastle Saturday, 1.30pm 28th June ITV1

Oli Bell presents racing from Newcastle, York and The Curragh - the feature race of the day is the Northumberland Plate, one of the big staying handicaps of the season.

There is also action from York on the schedule and coverage of the Group One Pretty Polly Stakes at The Curragh as well - reporting comes from Rishi Persad, Matt Chapman and Adele Mulrennan, and commentary on all the races is provided by Mark Johnson.



Suspicion Saturday, 11pm 28th June ITV1

A mystery thriller series about five ordinary Britons who try to prove their innocence when they are accused of kidnapping the son of a prominent US media mogul.

The drama continues as Vanessa (Angel Coulby) and Scott (Noah Emmerich) work together to interrogate the suspects in the case of the abduction of Katherine Newman's son - meanwhile, a mysterious figure manages to leave a path of destruction in his wake.









International Football: England v Jamaica Sunday, 4.10pm 29th June ITV1

Laura Woods is joined by Karen Carney and Anita Asante as England play their final fixture before the 2025 UEFA Women's Championship against Jamaica in Leicester.

The King Power Stadium is the venue for one last chance for Sarina Wiegman to finetune her starting 11 and her tactics ahead of the Lionesses' first group stage match against France - match commentary is provided by Seb Hutchinson and Lucy Ward.



Shardlake Monday, 9pm 30th June ITV1

A compelling whodunnit series, based on novels by CJ Sansom, about a brilliant lawyer with an acute sense of justice who investigates a murder at a monastery.

When Cromwell is furious with Shardlake's lack of results, the right-hand man to Henry VIII gives the lawyer a terrifying ultimatum - shocked after uncovering the history behind the murder weapon and the true owner of the sword, Shardlake faces a stark choice.









UEFA Women's Euro 2025: Iceland v Finland Wednesday, 4pm 2nd July ITV1

Laura Woods presents coverage as Euro 2025 kicks off in Switzerland with the opening game between Iceland and former semi-finalists Finland in the Arena Thun.

Iceland were quarter-finalists in 2013 and will be looking to go at least one better this time, and Finland will be aiming to match or better their 2005 semi-final showing 20 years on - coverage will also include in-depth previews of the England and Wales camps.



Long Lost Family: Born Without Trace Wednesday, 9pm 2nd July ITV1

Davina McCall and Nicky Campbell present the documentary series that combines new DNA technology with painstaking detective work to find answers for foundlings.

Left in the stairwell of a Surrey car park in 2001, this episode features the youngest foundling to appear to date and Chris who, at three months old, was dropped off at a childminder's near Kings Cross in London 62 years ago but had no-one return for him.









UEFA Women's Euro 2025: Spain v Portugal Thursday, 7.15pm 3rd July ITV1

World champions Spain start their Group B campaign against Iberian neighbours Portugal in Bern as the Portuguese hope for a closer contest than their last meeting.

That encounter in April 2025 in the Nations League saw Spain ease to a 7-1 victory with star players Alexia Putellas and Aitana Bonmati amongst the goals, but Portugal did manage a 1-1 draw with England and a 1-0 win over Belgium during the same campaign.



Fern Britton: Inside the Vet's Friday, 2pm 4th July ITV1

Fern Britton presents a series where she joins much-loved pets and their devoted owners behind the scenes at The Grove Vets, a busy family practice based in Bristol.

We meet the vets and the nursing staff who have welcomed Fern into their practice while she assists in the completion of doggy dentistry on a spaniel and meets the owners of a ten-year-old Cavachon that urgently needs to undergo orthopaedic surgery.









UEFA Women's Euro 2025: Denmark v Sweden Friday, 4.15pm 4th July ITV1

Seema Jaswal hosts coverage of a 2025 UEFA Women's Euro 2025 match between Denmark and Sweden as the Group C contenders face off in the city of Geneva.

These countries recently faced each other in the UEFA Women's Nations League - with Sweden winning on both occasions as they followed up on a 2-1 win in Odense in February 2025 with a 6-1 victory in Solna in June - and will be looking for a positive start.



UEFA Women's Euro 2025: Germany v Poland Friday, 7.15pm 4th July ITV1

Coverage as Germany, the dominant force in the Women's European Championship since the tournament first began, begin their 2025 group campaign against Poland.

Germany's history with the tournament goes back to 1984 and they have claimed the trophy eight times in that time, so the class of 2025 will be looking to start well in St Gallen against a Polish side who they beat twice in 2024 to qualify for the competition.

Transaction Tuesday, 10.05pm 1st July ITV2

Agatha Christie's Poirot Tuesday, 8pm 1st July ITV3

Doc Martin Sunday, 9pm 29th June ITV3

World Series of Darts: US Masters Saturday & Sunday, 5pm 28th & 29th June ITV4
