Police drama series about contrasting detectives Philip Boyd and Aoife Regan, who overcome their initial collaborative friction to form an unlikely crime-fighting duo.

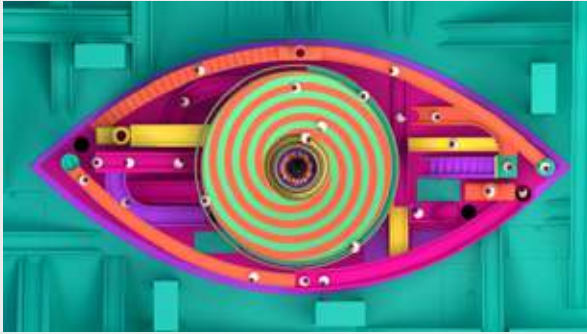
